Lord-Lieutenant of Greater London becomes inaugural President of YOU London



We are delighted to announce that Her Majesty's Lord-Lieutenant of Greater London, Sir Kenneth Olisa OBE, has become the inaugural President of YOU London. Sir Kenneth is Her Majesty's representative in Greater London and is charged with upholding the dignity of the Crown in the capital. Across the thirty-two boroughs (but not the City of London) he is responsible for the promotion of civic, commercial, voluntary and social activities within London supported by a team of over 100 Deputy Lieutenants, including a Representative Deputy Lieutenant for each London borough.

Sir Kenneth Olisa OBE is a businessman and philanthropist, the founder of two technology merchant banks and the first British-born black man to serve as a Director of a FTSE-100 company (Reuters).

An advocate of social inclusion, he is Chair of Thames Reach, a charity working to shelter and resettle the homeless; Chair of the Shaw Trust, supporting the disabled and chronically unemployed to find work; founding Chair of the Powerlist Foundation, supporting future leaders from Black and Minority Ethnic and disadvantaged backgrounds; a former Governor of the Peabody Trust; and a former Non-Executive Director of the West Lambeth NHS Trust.

Sir Kenneth's appointment is a natural fit with YOU London. In 2015, on his appointment to Lord-Lieutenant, he became President of the Reserve Forces' and Cadets' Association for Greater London (which provides the Secretariat for YOU London) and in 2019 he became President of London Youth, a member network of 450+ youth clubs across London, supporting tens of thousands of young Londoners each year. We hope that this appointment will see the two organisations, YOU London and London Youth, collaborating where appropriate to support young people, both in and out of uniform, across London.

National Emergencies Trust

Volunteer Police Cadets, St John Ambulance Cadets and Scouts supported the launch of a new charity, the National Emergencies Trust (NET), on Thursday 7th November 2019.

The launch took place in the Crypt of St Martin in the Fields church, Trafalgar Square in the presence of their Royal Highnesses The Duke and Duchess of Cambridge.



The National Emergencies Trust, www.nationalemergenciestrust.org.uk, will raise funds from the general public for the alleviation of needs in the event of a disaster or emergency in England. The funds collected will be distributed by local partners on the ground in the areas affected by the emergency event. It will essentially do for England what the Disasters and Emergency Committee (DEC) www.dec.org.uk does internationally.



The NET will deal with the fundraising and fund distribution aspects of disaster response in England. It was set up to ensure the charity sector is more joined up and co-ordinated in the way it harnesses and guides generous public support for disasters. The NET will set up a single national fund, which will help direct fundraising by existing charities and have expertise regarding the allocation of funds.



Chief Executive Officer of the National Emergencies Trust, John Herriman, said "We are extremely grateful to all the cadets who supported our launch. It was fantastic to have them there!"

Many people will have seen Prince William on the news recently encouraging the public to donate to the NET to raise funds for people requiring support due to the Coronavirus. At the time of writing, a staggering £25m has been raised to support those in need of help.

Challenge South London

'Challenge South London' saw over 130 young people take part in two fun-filled, action-packed days of activities hosted by the Royal Marines Reserve (City of London) and Southfields Academy in co-operation with the Metropolitan Police Service, during the February half term.



The event, for young people aged 14-18 from the boroughs of Wandsworth, Merton, Richmond and Kingston, comprised of six challenges delivered by the Royal Marines, Harlequins RFC, BeMilitaryFit, Powerleague and the London Fire Brigade. The challenges included abseiling, rugby, football, self-defence and retrieving a casualty from a burning building, to stretch participants' endurance, mental strength and self-esteem, embodying the characteristics of the Royal Marines: Courage, Determination, Unselfishness and Cheerfulness.



One aim of the event was to encourage respect for the uniformed services by bringing young people in to contact with representatives from each organisation; showcasing some of the roles they perform in the community and the career opportunities available within each service.

Another aim was to divert young people away from anti-social behaviour towards a more positive future. With knife crime amongst young people in

London being an ongoing issue, 'Challenge South London' aimed to encourage young people not to carry edge weapons and to teach them how to defend themselves against potentially harmful situations.



Commanding Officer of the Royal Marines Reserve (City of London) Lieutenant Colonel Jason Durup said: *"Challenge South London' aims to support the Metropolitan Police's 'Divert' programme by giving young people the confidence, through teaching them different skills, that they can evade and avoid edge weapon threats and not become a statistic."*

The guests arrived at Wellington Barracks to watch the Commanding Officer's inspection of the Troop before they left the barracks.



Six gun teams of six horses pulled First World War-era 13-pounder field guns to perform the salutes in Green Park.

Following the salutes, the guests returned to Wellington Barracks for a buffet lunch and a behind-the-scenes tour of the stables.

Assistant Commissioner Helen Ball presented awards to the VPC Co-ordinator of the Year and Best Junior and Senior Cadet of the Year.
