

YOU LONDON LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT CONFERENCE

YOU London partnered with Alleyn's School in Dulwich to deliver a leadership development weekend for young people aged 15 to 17, encouraging them to "be all they can be".

Over 100 young people from 9 different uniformed youth organisations listened to inspiring speakers and took part in a number of practical challenges over the weekend of 5th and 6th November. The challenges, run by the Met Police, London Fire Brigade, St John Ambulance, Army Cadet Training Team, Royal Air Force Air Cadet Engagement Team, Royal Navy, Alleyn's School CCF and Rheinmetall BAE Systems Land included the execution of a search warrant, fire hose drills, first aid triage, a gun run, collaborative flight simulation, command tasks, virtual reality battle drills, and a STEM challenge.

'777' CHALLENGE

<u>Sally Orange</u> is an international endurance athlete, mental health campaigner, Guiness World Record holder, ACF Ambassador and the only person in the world to have run a marathon on every continent dressed as a piece of fruit!

From 31 January to 6 February 2023, Sally will be participating in the <u>World Marathon Challenge</u> which will see her run 7 marathons in 7 continents in 7 days for 7 charities. If successful, Sally will become just the fifth British woman and the first female military veteran to have undertaken this incredible achievement.

YOU London would like to use this event to inspire and challenge you to achieve something for yourself based around the number 7. It could be anything you like – 7 laps of a swimming pool, 7 good deeds in 7 days, running 700 metres for 7 days – anything that you can think of, the more imaginative the better. We suggest that you ask 7 friends to sponsor you £7 each, but if that is not practical in the current financial climate, why not ask 7 friends to sponsor you £1 each, thereby raising £7 in sponsorship?

What could you do based around the number 7 to support Sally and raise vital funds for charity?

YOU London had a float in the Lord Mayor's Show on Saturday 12th November. The theme of the float was the Duke of Edinburgh's Award scheme as it is one of the incoming Lord Mayor's two chosen charities and one of the key things most YOU groups have in common. Our float consisted of young people and adult volunteers from the Army Cadet Force, Boys' Brigade, Colfe's School CCF, Scouts, Sea Cadet Corps, St John Ambulance and Brent Volunteer Police Cadets.

The Boys' Brigade provided a minibus as part of the float and the Reserve Forces' and Cadets' Association for Greater London covered the costs of having it YOU liveried. DL CERTIFICATES

The nomination process is currently open for Deputy Lieutenant Certificate submissions, the deadline being 31 January 2023. This scheme has been open to all YOU London organisations since 2018.

Deputy Lieutenant Certificates are awarded to young people (aged 15 or over on 31 January 2023) to give recognition to their achievements within their organisation and to create an awareness of their contribution within the community. Nominations should be completed initially by unit commanders, then sent to the next level up to put forward ideally one or two candidates from each organisation per borough. Final submissions should be submitted by regional headquarters, to ensure consistency across the region. Candidates should be assessed not only on their professional performance but on personal qualities, social responsibility and success in other fields such as the Duke of Edinburgh's Award and other awards and education or sporting achievements.

To be eligible for a certificate, a young person must belong to a unit situated within the boundary of a London borough. Framed Deputy Lieutenant Certificates will be presented by the Representative Deputy Lieutenant for that borough during the course of 2023. Presentation events vary widely from visits to units, to a joint presentation with the mayor. Become a Mentor

<u>Fighting Knife Crime London</u> is an online directory, news resource and magazine to support the fight against Knife Crime in London. By providing an up-todate news facility, a regular magazine, video resources, a research area, and a growing and highly accessible directory of organisations, the aim of the website is to address the causes and effects of knife crime, and all forms of violence.

BOROUGH VOLUNTEER CENTRES

Did you know that every borough in London has a Volunteer Centre, which seeks to match willing volunteers with local volunteering opportunities? (Universities also have student volunteering centres, for any units based near a university.) These volunteer centres are well worth registering local unit adult vacancies with.

Top tip: UCL research has found that organisations have more success filling volunteering vacancies when descriptions of volunteering tasks are specific rather than general, e.g. 'we are looking for a person between 1930-2130 on a Tuesday evening to do [insert list of possible tasks]'. Do give the detail...
