DOB Year (by decade)




Figure 1: Spread of Ages in the Survey




Figure 2: Percentages – Gender




Figure 3: Geographic Spread of Survey Participants (local unit when in Sea Cadets)




Figure 4: Long-term Impact – Independence by Decade Cohorts




