CELEBRATING VOLUNTEERS




This year, LFB Fire Cadets held their annual celebration of volunteering during Volunteers Week (always the first full week of June). Over 80 Volunteer Cadet Instructors (VCIs) attended the annual Volunteer Celebration evening. Nine Volunteer Cadet Instructors received awards to recognise 5 years of volunteering, and 8 Volunteer Cadet Instructors received their 10 years of volunteering awards.

LFB Fire Cadets were also celebrating the fact that this year their volunteers had given a collective 5325 hours of volunteering across 24 cadet units, providing Fire Cadet opportunities for young people from every borough in London.

Deputy Lieutenant Certificates are awarded to young people worthy of recognition for their service to either their unit or the community, within each London borough.


SIMPLY VOLUNTEER LONDON

Connects

- Matching volunteers to local organisations.
- Additional specific services, e.g., supporting volunteers with disabilities, or corporate volunteering

Promotes

- Raises the profile of volunteering locally, increasing awareness amongst the general public, policymakers and funders.
- Provides strategic leadership on issues related to volunteering.

Supports

- Provides information and advice for volunteers and prospective volunteers, but also volunteerinvolving organisations.
- Supports the local voluntary and community response to emergencies.

Represents

- Represents and advocates for volunteers and volunteer-involving organisations.
- Provides local insights and amplifies the voice of communities, volunteers, and volunteer-involving organisations.

WHAT DIFFERENCE DO UNIFORMED YOUTH GROUPS MAKE?

There is all sorts of evidence illustrating the positive impact that membership of a uniformed youth group can have on the lives of young people. This page seeks to summarise some of this information in one place. Click on each image to read each report.



In February, as part of its 'Youth Evidence Review' designed to strengthen the evidence base around the impact of the youth sector, the Department for Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS) published three papers on '<u>youth provision and life outcomes'</u>. The three papers covered:

- A study of longitudinal research
- A study of international evidence
- A study of the local impact of youth clubs

Scouts

The report found: "There is a clear association between participation in youth provision and positive shortterm outcomes relating to physical health and wellbeing, pro-social behaviours and education. There is also strong evidence that these short-term outcomes are sustained over decades and, compared with nonparticipants, people who attended youth clubs continue to score more highly for several of these indicators of wellbeing."

YOU CROYDON CHALLENGE

Around 100 young people participated in the annual YOU Croydon Challenge on Sunday 2 June 2024, organised by YOU (Youth Organisations in Uniform) Croydon. The event was superbly hosted by Royal Russell School CCF, who even seemed to organise the sunshine!

On arrival, young people from Croydon units of the Army Cadets, Fire Cadets, Girlguiding, Scouts, Sea Cadets, Volunteer Police Cadets and members of Royal Russell School CCF were split into mixed syndicates. They then completed nine challenges run by the adult volunteer leaders from each organisation, designed to develop their teamwork and leadership skills.

Some of the activity stands included an observation stand run by the Army Cadets, a vehicle search run by the Volunteer Police Cadets, a team building exercise run by the RAF CCF Training Team and a 'toxic waste transfer' run by the Sea Cadets. Other activities such as an archery competition run by Girlguiding Croydon and a mobile climbing wall run by Croydon Scouting ensured a fun mix of challenges during the day. The event finished with a delicious BBQ courtesy of Royal Russell School.

The Civic Mayor of Croydon, Councillor Kola Agboola, took time out of his busy schedule to visit the event and talk to the young people, alongside Councillor Tony Pearson, Croydon Council's Armed Forces Champion.

The winning team, Team 5, were presented with gold YOU London pin badges by Colonel Hugh Purcell OBE DL, Chair of YOU London. In his closing speech at the end of the day, Colonel Ray Wilkinson QVRM TD DL VR, Representative Deputy Lieutenant for the London Borough of Croydon said: "Thank you for attending, and particular thanks to all the adult volunteers for planning and delivering the event today. Without your dedication, this event could not have happened. I've seen so much commitment, enthusiasm and energy today from both the young people and adult volunteers, that it gives me great hope for the future of Croydon."
