

The benefits of volunteering with Uniformed Youth Organisations to Individuals and Employers

A research team from the Institute for Social Innovation and Impact at the University of Northampton has been commissioned by the Ministry of Defence to identify the impacts and benefits of the Cadet Forces of the UK (Army Cadet Force, Royal Air Force Air Cadets, Sea Cadets and Combined Cadet Force). The University has published four research reports since 2021 covering the whole of the UK, the most recent of which was launched on 7th April 2025 by the Minister for Veterans and People. The research has identified the adult volunteers that enable the Cadet Forces to operate and benefit young people also gain significant benefits, as do their employers. This document presents a (very) simplified summary of these benefits.
